Text-John 2:1-11

- 1. On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there.
- 2. Now both Jesus and His disciples were invited to the wedding.
- 3. And when they ran out of wine, the mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine."
- 4. Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does your concern have to do with Me? My hour has not yet come."
- 5. His mother said to the servants, "Whatever He says to you, do it."
- 6. Now there were set there six waterpots of stone, according to the manner of purification of the Jews, containing twenty or thirty gallons apiece.
- 7. Jesus said to them, "Fill the waterpots with water." And they filled them up to the brim.
- 8. And He said to them, "Draw some out now, and take it to the master of the feast." And they took it.
- 9. When the master of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and did not know where it came from (but the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom.
- 10. And he said to him, "Every man at the beginning sets out the good wine, and when the guests have well drunk, then the inferior. You have kept the good wine until now!"
- 11. This beginning of signs Jesus did in Cana of Galilee, and manifested His glory; and His disciples believed in Him.

Family and friends continued to gather to celebrate the wedding of their loved ones. Along with lots of food, gifts and drink, a Jewish wedding also includes the hora. It is a dance where the newlyweds are lifted into the air on chairs, while family and friends dance in a circle around them. The couple each holds one end of a handkerchief or napkin as all the guests dance.

It must have been a grand celebration! So many people attended that they were running out of wine, and it would have been rude for the guests not to have some. Would they have to stop the celebration early?






Text-John 4:46-54

- 46. So Jesus came again to Cana of Galilee where He had made the water wine. And there was a certain nobleman whose son was sick at Capernaum.
- 47. When he heard that Jesus had come out of Judea into Galilee, he went to Him and implored Him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death.
- 48. Then Jesus said to him, "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you will by no means believe."
- 49. The nobleman said to Him, "Sir, come down before my child dies!"
- 50. Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your son lives." So the man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him, and he went his way.
- 51. And as he was now going down, his servants met him and told him, saying, "Your son lives!"
- 52. Then he inquired of them the hour when he got better. And they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him."
- 53. So the father knew that it was at the same hour in which Jesus said to him, "Your son lives." And he himself believed, and his whole household.

- 40. Now a leper came to Him, imploring Him, kneeling down to Him and saying to Him, "If You are willing, You can make me clean."
- 41 Then Jesus, moved with compassion, stretched out His hand and touched him, and said to him, "I am willing; be cleansed."
- 42 As soon as He had spoken, immediately the leprosy left him, and he was cleansed.
- 43 And He strictly warned him and sent him away at once,
- 44 and said to him, "See that you say nothing to anyone; but go your way, show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing those things which Moses commanded, as a testimony to them."
- 45 However, he went out and began to proclaim it freely, and to spread the matter, so that Jesus could no longer openly enter the city, but was outside in deserted places; and they came to Him from every direction.



- 35.On the same day, when evening had come, He said to them, "Let us cross over to the other side."
- 36. Now when they had left the multitude, they took Him along in the boat as He was. And other little boats were also with Him.
- 37. And a **great windstorm** arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that it was already filling.
- 38. But He was in the stern, asleep on a pillow. And they awoke Him and said to Him, "Teacher, do You not care that we are perishing?"
- 39. Then He arose and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace, be still!" And the wind ceased and there was a **great calm**.
- 40. But He said to them, "Why are you so fearful? How is it that you have no faith?"
- 41. And they feared exceedingly, and said to one another, "Who can this be, that even the wind and the sea obey Him!"



Mark 5:1-20

- 1. Then they came to the other side of the sea, to the country of the Gadarenes.
- 2. And when He had come out of the boat, immediately there met Him out of the tombs a man with an unclean spirit,
- 3. who had his dwelling among the tombs; and no one could bind him, not even with chains,
- 4. because he had often been bound with shackles and chains. And the chains had been pulled apart by him, and the shackles broken in pieces; neither could anyone tame him.
- 5. And always, night and day, he was in the mountains and in the tombs, crying out and cutting himself with stones.
- 6. When he saw Jesus from afar, he ran and worshiped Him.
- 7. And he cried out with a loud voice and said, "What have I to do with You, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I implore You by God that You do not torment me."
- 8. For He said to him, "Come out of the man, unclean spirit!"
- 9. Then He asked him, "What is your name?" And he answered, saying, "My name is Legion; for we are many."
- 10. Also he begged Him earnestly that He would not send them out of the country.
- 11. Now a large herd of swine was feeding there near the mountains.
- 12. So all the demons begged Him, saying, "Send us to the swine, that we may enter them."
- 13. And at once Jesus gave them permission. Then the unclean spirits went out and entered the swine (there were about two thousand); and the herd ran violently down the steep place into the sea, and drowned in the sea.
- 14. So those who fed the swine fled, and they told it in the city and in the country. And they went out to see what it was that had happened.
- 15. Then they came to Jesus, and saw the one who had been demon-possessed and had the legion, sitting and clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid.
- 16. And those who saw it told them how it happened to him who had been demon-possessed, and about the swine.
- 17. Then they began to plead with Him to depart from their region.
- 18. And when He got into the boat, he who had been demon-possessed begged Him that he might be with Him.
- 19. However, Jesus did not permit him, but said to him, "Go home to your friends, and tell them what great things the Lord has done for you, and how He has had compassion on you."
- 20. And he departed and began to proclaim in Decapolis all that Jesus had done for him; and all marveled.



- 32. So they departed to a deserted place in the boat by themselves.



Mark 10:46-52

- 46. Now they came to Jericho. As He went out of Jericho with His disciples and a great multitude, blind Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus, sat by the road begging.
- 47. And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"
- 48. Then many warned him to be quiet; but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!"
- 49. So Jesus stood still and commanded him to be called. Then they called the blind man, saying to him, "Be of good cheer. Rise, He is calling you."
- 50. And throwing aside his garment, he rose and came to Jesus.
- 51. So Jesus answered and said to him, "What do you want Me to do for you?" The blind man said to Him, "Rabboni, that I may receive my sight."
- 52. Then Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus on the road.
 - Perhaps some people in the crowd thought it embarrassing that Bartimaeus would be calling for Jesus with such a loud voice. But this blind man was desperate!
 Jesus was passing his way for the last time. He was on His way to Jerusalem to pay for the sins of the world. Bartimaeus had to get His attention and although he couldn't see where Jesus was, he hoped that Jesus would hear his cry. What did he want from Jesus? (vs.47, 48)








Where do I see myself in this miracle?
